Part 1

A) Comprehension questions on the text. Read the text and choose the correct answer (0,5 points each).

Archaeologists in Egypt have discovered a huge cemetery hidden under the sands south of Cairo. The 2,000-year-old necropolis was found south of Egypt's capital in the Nile Valley city of Minya. The word necropolis is from ancient Greek and means "city of the dead". The necropolis contains thousands of artifacts, including coffins and statues. Archaeologists started excavation work on the site late last year. They found tombs belonging to priests of Thoth who was the ancient god of the moon and wisdom. Thoth was also believed to be the inventor of writing. Egypt's Antiquities Minister, Khaled al-Anani, said that they will need at least five years to work on the necropolis, and that that was only the beginning of a new discovery.

Mostafa Waziri, the head of the archaeological dig, explained that he was very excited about the contents of the site. He said he and his colleagues have uncovered eight tombs so far and expects many more to be found soon. The tombs contain a wealth of historic treasures. One tomb, for example, includes more than 1,000 statues and four pottery jars

that contain the remains of the internal organs of important ancient Egyptians. Mr Waziri also said there were 40 sarcophagi. A sarcophagus is a Stone coffin in which dead bodies were placed. Waziri hopes the new site will help to attract more tourists to Egypt. There has been a downturn in tourism since the revolution that took place there in 2011.
